Scholarships for highest marks in specific subject areas for graduating students will be given to students who achieved the highest mark within the last two years (Grade 11 and Grade 12).

Although the information is kept as current as possible, it is not intended to be a conclusive list of all scholarships students may apply for. Students are encouraged to seek other sources of information including the Internet. The information contained in this booklet is subject to change without notice.

### **Tips to consider when applying for Awards:**

1. Seek out all awards that you qualify for including those on the Internet.
2. Be neat, tidy and complete all applications in pen or have them typed. Have it proofread for spelling errors.
3. Attach a covering letter with each application. Address it to the person accepting applications for the award suggesting why you best qualify. This helps to personalize your application.
4. Complete all parts of the form, enclose or attach all information that is requested.
5. Ask references before hand if you may use their name as a reference.
6. Complete all applications by the deadline. Late applications are generally disqualified.
7. Be confident, now is the time to tell the selection committee about yourself. Give them details and information you are proud of.
8. Be gracious in your acceptance. Thank you letters are appropriate to send to the donor after you have received your award.
9. If you are chosen for an award plan to attend the awards ceremony in person.

**If you need a letter of reference or recommendation to accompany your scholarship application, you must provide your referee AT LEAST two weeks notice before the scholarship deadline. Do not expect your references to do a good job for you in response to last minute requests. Be aware ahead of time of what needs to be done to finalize your application.**

## SECTION I - DIDSBURY HIGH SCHOOL AWARDS AND SCHOLARSHIPS

### A. AWARDS – No application necessary

**1. DHS VALEDICTORIAN**

The Valedictorian must have the highest average from at least five of the following academic courses: English 30-1, Social 30-1, Math 30-1, Biology 30, Chemistry 30, Physics 30, French 30 or Math 31

**2. DHS ALL ROUND STUDENT AWARDS - plaque**

This award is given to an individual that is involved in all aspects of school, family, community, academics and is socially accepted by their peers and teachers.

**3. MEDALLION AWARDS – TOP MARK IN A COURSE ABOVE 80%- Medallion**

**3. SPIRIT OF YOUTH AWARD - plaque**

This award is given a student who possesses those personal characteristics which, if exhibited by all students, would make the school a better community. Displays honesty, integrity, friendliness, politeness, helpfulness and diligence.

**4. DRAGONS CODE AWARD - plaque**

Awarded to a student who consistently demonstrates the values of respect, responsibility, caring, trust and family (The Dragons Code).

**5. TOP ATHLETE – (1 male and 1 female) - plaque**

Awarded to one male and one female who perform at a very high level in a number of extra-curricular DHS sports teams.

**6. Governor's General Bronze Award – Medal and Certificate – Awarded to the student with the highest grade average of all gr. 11 and gr. 12 marks**

### B. DHS SCHOLARSHIPS – Applications are available in the office in April – these scholarships and amounts vary from year to year. Eligibility is 65% average in top 50 credits from grade 11 and 12.

**DONORS AND FUNDS MAY VARY FROM YEAR TO YEAR – Total amount distributed in June 2018 was over \$25,000.**

## SECTION III - CENTRAL ALBERTA AWARDS AND SCHOLARSHIPS

1. **ACADEMY OF PROFESSIONAL HAIR DESIGN** - \$250 off tuition  
To be eligible nominees must demonstrate excellent ability and aptitude for the Cosmetology vocation, demonstrate an excellent attendance record.
2. **Calgary Exhibition & Stampede Art Scholarship Program** – (various amounts)  
Graduating students must submit specified artwork. Applications available in Dec.- Jan.
3. **CBI SCHOLARSHIP** - \$500.00  
Awarded to students entering mechanical type trade or mechanical engineer tech or degree program. Deadline is **June 30**.
4. **CENTRAL ALBERTA RURAL ELECTRIFICATION ASSOCIATION SCHOLARSHIP** – two of \$1000  
To be awarded to the top male and top female applicants. One parent or a legal guardian must be a member in good standing of the Central Alberta rural Electrification Association at the time of application. Applicants will be judged on their academic success, based on the average of their five highest Grade 12 courses and on a career goals essay. Deadline July 1<sup>st</sup>. Applications usually available in April.

5. **CENTRAL ALBERTA VINTAGE AUTO CLUB BURSARY** - \$350  
Students must have completed 15 credits in high school Mechanics courses and be pursuing post-secondary education in mechanics field. Apply by August 29<sup>th</sup>.
6. **COMMUNITY SAVINGS SCHOLARSHIPS** - \$1500 1<sup>ST</sup> place, \$1000 2<sup>nd</sup> place, \$500 3<sup>rd</sup> place  
To graduating students continuing their education at a post-secondary institution. Winners determined by mean average of final marks in 5 core subjects. Deadline September 1<sup>st</sup>.
7. **MARVEL COLLEGE SCHOLARSHIP** - \$1,000 towards tuition  
To be eligible students must demonstrate outstanding dedication and ability in the field of hairstyling, as well as having an excellent attendance record. See your cosmetology teacher for details. Deadline is January or May.
8. **Mountain View Credit Union Ltd.** – 4 – Canada, 1 – local region \$1000.00  
Canada deadline is February 26, Regional is April 30.
9. **RED DEER ALLIED ARTS COUNCIL CENTENNIAL SCHOLARSHIP** - 3 awards of \$500  
One award is given for each of: Performing Arts (dance, theatre, music), visual Arts and Literary Arts to recognize student excellence. Applications usually available at the end of September. Deadline November 15.
10. **Foothills Natural Gas Co-op – Olds, AB - \$500.00** – Deadline Oct. 31
11. **Lions Legacy Scholarship – Lions of Alberta Foundation \$500.00** – Deadline Sept. 15

## SECTION IV - PROVINCIAL SCHOLARSHIPS

1. **ABORIGINAL BUSINESS LEADERSHIP AWARDS** - \$1,500 (10 available)  
For Aboriginal students pursuing an education in Business or Commerce in any public post secondary educational institute in Alberta. Deadline June 15<sup>th</sup>.
2. **AGVANTAGE 25 UFA SCHOLARSHIPS** - \$2500 (2 available)  
Students pursuing a post-secondary education who are able to demonstrate or display intent to enhance the rural Canadian community through their education are eligible for this scholarship. UFA Agvantage 25 membership is required - membership is free by contacting a local UFA Coop. Applications available around mid January. Deadline March 20<sup>th</sup>.
3. **ALBERTA ASSOCIATION OF MUNICIPAL DISTRICTS AND COUNTY (AAMD&C)** - \$1000  
Eligible students must be rural residents proceeding to an Alberta post-secondary institution. Community involvement and academic performance are considered. Deadline is July 31<sup>st</sup>. Applications available in May.
4. **ALBERTA BLUE CROSS SCHOLARSHIPS** - \$350 to \$1250  
Several awards are available at many Alberta Colleges and Universities. Contact the post-secondary institution Awards office where you plan to attend for an application form. Five categories of scholarships are:
  1. Entrance Awards
  2. Travelers (for those located more than 100 km from home)
  3. Special Needs
  4. Aboriginal Awards
  5. Students specializing in Computer Systems, Nursing/Health Sciences, Dentistry, Medicine or Pharmacy



**5. ALBERTA SOCIETY OF ARTISTS' *summerscapes* ATHABASCA SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM**

For students age 15-17 wishing to explore the world of visual art. Four scholarships provide the cost of tuition, meals, accommodation and art supplies at Red Deer College's *summerscapes* program (value \$345 per scholarship). Must have a teacher recommendation. Applications available in March. Deadline May 15<sup>th</sup>.

**6. ALBERTA UNION OF PROVINCIAL EMPLOYEES**

a. AUPE Bursaries/Endowments are set up with the following Institutions for first and subsequent year students:

Universities - Augustana, Calgary, Lethbridge

Technological Institutes - NAIT, SAIT

Colleges - Fairview, Grande Prairie, Grant MacEwan, Keyano, Lakeland, Lethbridge Community, Medicine Hat, Mount Royal, Olds, Red Deer

These are tenable at post-secondary institutions. Apply online anytime once you are registered at a post-secondary institution. <http://alis.alberta.ca/index.html>

Any two other subjects at the Grade 10 level including those listed above and combined introductory CTS courses

**8. AL LARSON SCHOLARSHIP**

Children of a realtor who is a member of the local Real Estate Board and who are proceeding with post-secondary education may contact the Alberta Real Estate Association, 2424 - 4<sup>th</sup> St., S.W., Calgary, AB T2S 2T4

**9. ANNA & JOHN KOLESAR MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP - \$1200**

Applicants for the Anna & John Kolesar Memorial Scholarship must be Alberta residents and from a family where neither parent obtained a university degree. In addition, they must have obtained a grade 12 diploma after January 1, 1988 and must be enrolling for full-time study in the first year of a program in a Faculty of Education. Based on final standings in three academic subjects including English 30. Deadline July 1<sup>st</sup>.

**10. AON CONSULTING ACHIEVEMENT AWARD - \$2000**

Children of members of the Federation of Alberta Gas Co-ops as well as children of landowners who are serviced with gas in member towns, villages, counties or bands. Proceeding to post secondary degree or diploma program and have an academic standing of at least 75% in core subjects in Grade 11 and 12 years.

**11. BOYS AND GIRLS CLUBS OF ALBERTA SCHOLARSHIP – 3 Scholarships of \$500**

Each year three \$500 scholarships will be awarded to students who are or were members of one of the Boys and Girls Clubs of Alberta. Awards are based on marks, recommendation letter and information supplied by their sponsoring club. Deadline July 1. Applications usually available in April.

**12. C.A. MACLEAN JOURNALISM BURSARY - amount varies**

For graduating students or those studying journalism or employees of an Alberta Weekly Newspaper are invited to apply to their weekly newspaper office. Deadline for applications varies. Check at the Lacombe Globe for applications.

**13. CHARLES S. NOBLE SCHOLARSHIP FOR STUDY AT HARVARD - \$10,000**

Two scholarships per year are awarded for undergraduate study at Harvard. Apply to the Students Finance Board, see the address in this booklet, Section XII.

**14. DEPUTY FIRE CHIEF HAL HARRISON MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP - \$250**

Applicants must be Alberta residents who plan to enroll full-time in a post-secondary program of at least one semester in length. At least one of their parents must be a member in good standing with the Alberta Volunteer Firefighters Association. Selection will be made on the basis of marks in five core grade 12 courses. Deadline June 1<sup>st</sup>. Applications available in April.

**15. DR. ERNEST & MINNIE MEHL SCHOLARSHIP - \$3500**

Based on scholastic achievement in Grade 12 diploma examinations, financial need and commitment of the individual. Criteria will be the same as the Rutherford Scholar Awards. Recommendations of school principals and financial information will also be considered. Applications usually available the second week in April. Deadline is June 1<sup>st</sup>.

**16. EARL AND COUNTESS OF WESSEX – EDMONTON 2001 WORLD CHAMPIONSHIPS IN ATHLETICS SCHOLARSHIPS – 2 awards of \$3,000 each**

Recognizes the top male and top female Alberta students who have excelled in track and field, have a strong academic record and plan to continue their studies at the post-secondary level in Alberta. Must have completed grade 12 in the year of application and earned an average of 80% or higher in 5 subjects. Must also be planning on joining the Track and Field team at their chosen post-secondary. Application deadline October 1. Applications usually available in April.

**17. HAL NELDER SCHOLARSHIP - \$1500**

Students whose parents are employed by Telus and who will be attending post-secondary education are eligible to apply. Averages will be based on five specific grade 12 courses. Deadline is June 1<sup>st</sup>.

**18. IODE. CORONATION BURSARY (PROVINCIAL CHAPTER) - \$1000**

To be eligible you must have been an Alberta resident for at least 3 years; enter any degree-granting program in Alberta; financial need is considered. Applications are available online at: [www.iodealberta.com](http://www.iodealberta.com). Deadline is July 15.

**19. LEN SAGER MEMORIAL AWARD - \$500**

Grade 12 students who have worked to prevent impaired driving tragedies in their community and are going to further their education at a college or university are eligible to apply for a \$500 award. One is given to a southern Alberta student and one to a northern Alberta student. Applications available mid March. Deadline June 20<sup>th</sup>.

**20. MASONIC BURSARIES - \$1000**

Goes towards tuition at post-secondary institutions in Alberta. Priority given to those who do not receive a Rutherford Scholarship. This award is based on financial need. Apply before March 1<sup>st</sup>. Please hand completed applications to the office by February 15.

**21. PERSONS CASE SCHOLARSHIP - \$1000**

This scholarship honours the efforts of five Alberta women. Criteria considered will be financial need, program of studies and academic achievement. Women entering nontraditional fields are encouraged to apply.

**22. PREMIER'S CITIZENSHIP AWARD**

To recognize students graduating from high school who have supported and contributed to Alberta communities through public service and voluntary endeavours. Recipients will receive a plaque and a letter of commendation from the Premier. One award is available for each high school in Alberta. Nomination deadline to Alberta Scholarship Programs June 15.

**23. QUEEN ELIZABETH II GOLDEN JUBILEE CITIZENSHIP MEDAL**

This award was created to commemorate the Queen's Golden Jubilee in 2002. The five most outstanding recipients of the Premier's Citizenship Award will receive the Queen's Golden Jubilee citizenship Medal, a letter of commendation from the Lieutenant Governor, and \$5,000. Nomination deadline June 15 to Alberta Scholarship Programs.

**24. RAP SCHOLARSHIP - up to 500 scholarships of \$1000**

Must have completed a minimum of 250 hours of on-the-job training in a Registered Apprenticeship Program and plan on continuing in a regular apprenticeship program. Deadline June 30. Applications can also be found at [www.tradesecrets.org](http://www.tradesecrets.org).

**25. ROYAL CANADIAN LEGION LADIES' AUXILIARY BURSARY, ALBERTA-N.W.T. COMMAND- \$500**

Open to graduating students entering any post-secondary institution. The bursary is intended to assist children, grandchildren and great-grandchildren of ex-service or currently serving personnel. Deadline is August 25<sup>th</sup>.

**26. STAPLES SCHOLARSHIPS - \$2000**

Students entering a Faculty of Business or Commerce and who have attained a high average in their academic subjects. Deadline is June 30.

**27. TD CANADA TRUST SCHOLARSHIPS FOR OUTSTANDING COMMUNITY LEADERSHIP**

- \$500 to a possible \$60,000

Awarded to students in their final year of high school who have shown exceptional initiative in making a meaningful and lasting difference in their community. Each scholarship includes full tuition at any accredited university or college in Canada, \$5,000 a year towards living expenses and a guaranteed offer of summer employment from TD Canada Trust. Final deadline October 31<sup>st</sup>. Applications available near the end of September.

## **SECTION V – NATIONAL & GENERAL SCHOLARSHIPS**

- 1. ABORIGINAL HEALTH CAREERS BURSARY - up to \$1000**  
For an aboriginal or metis resident of Alberta enrolling in a post secondary health related program of studies. Deadline is May 15<sup>th</sup>.
- 2. AUTOMOTIVE INDUSTRIES ASSOCIATION (AIA) CANADA AUTOMOTIVE AFTERMARKET SCHOLARSHIPS**  
**ARTHUR PAULIN SCHOLARSHIP - \$700**  
Applicants must be enrolled in an automotive aftermarket industry related program of curriculum at a Canadian college or university. This includes students pursuing their studies as an automotive apprentice. It also includes studies in auto body, hard parts, heavy duty, or motive power (machinists). Deadline October 31<sup>st</sup>. Information and applications forms are available at [www.aiacanada.com](http://www.aiacanada.com).  
**HANS McCORRISTON SCHOLARSHIP - \$500**  
Applicants must be enrolled in the AIA Motive Power machinist Training Program or a college level machinist training program within Canada. Deadline October 15<sup>th</sup>. Information and application forms are available at [www.aiacanada.com](http://www.aiacanada.com).
- 3. THE ASSOCIATION OF PROFESSIONAL ENGINEERS, GEOLOGISTS & GEOPHYSICISTS OF ALBERTA (APEGGA) - \$3000**  
Twelve scholarships in the field of Engineering, Geology & Geophysics.  
Tenable at Universities and transfer Colleges in Alberta.  
Scholarship selection is based on Grade 12 marks, extracurricular activities, three references, financial need and the student's written statement outlining reasons for desire to enter the profession. Deadline is July 15<sup>th</sup>. Applications available at [www.apegga.org](http://www.apegga.org).
- 4. BURGER KING SCHOLARS PROGRAM – 1,500 of \$1,000 in U.S, Puerto Rico and Canada**  
Student to be nominated (by request) on the basis of: cumulative high school GPA of 2.5 or higher on a 4.0 scale, works an average of at least 15 hours a week for 40 weeks a year, demonstration of participation in community service and/or co-curricular activities, demonstration of financial need. Deadline December 15.
- 5. CANADIAN ASSOCIATION OF PRINCIPALS - \$500**  
Students who have demonstrated academic success and have participated in community and school activities such as sports, clubs or student council are eligible to apply. Deadline is March 31<sup>st</sup>. Applications available in the Career Centre. LCHS candidate will be selected by Scholarship committee.
- 6. CANADIAN FORCES COMMUNICATION RESERVE EDUCATION BENEFIT – up to \$2,000 per year, 4 years**  
Must be a member of the Reserves, have completed basic training within the first year the benefit is claimed, and be enrolled in an approved course of study. Tuition & eligible fees reimbursed at the end of each academic year. For more information, contact the 749 Communication Squadron at 350-6655.
- 7. CANADIAN GOLF FOUNDATION SCHOLARSHIP - \$4000**

- 9. CANADIAN MERIT SCHOLARSHIP FOUNDATION (CMSF)** - amount varies (\$500 to over \$16,000 per year of study for up to 4 years)  
By applying on one application, applicants are applying for a wide variety of awards. Successful applicants will possess a demonstrated ability to carry a substantial academic load in addition to demonstrated leadership potential and interest in service activities in and out of school. Deadline for Sponsored Applicants: October 24, for Direct Pool Applicants: November 3. Must be graduating and have a minimum average of 85%. Applications available around mid-September.
- 10. CUNNINGHAM & LINDSAY SCHOLARSHIP** - \$1000

Up to 25 scholarships available annually to specific community colleges. This award is renewable for up to 4 years of study.  
The following 2 **GWMSC** awards are one-time only entrance awards tenable at **any** public, accredited Community College in Canada:  
**GWMSC Regional Award:** Up to 18 available annually, worth \$4,000  
**GWMSC Provincial Award:** Up to 15 available annually, worth \$2,500  
One application is used for all 3 GWMSC scholarships. Deadline February 13.
- 14. HAL HARRISON MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP** - \$250

This is a five-week summer program designed to provide an opportunity to learn French as a second language and to improve knowledge of the French culture. Applicants must be in at least Grade 11, Alberta residents, full-time students and be enrolled or intending to enroll in post-secondary studies. Contact the French teacher for applications. Deadline is mid-February.

**24. TERRY FOX HUMANITARIAN AWARD PROGRAM - \$2500 to \$6000**

Field of Study - any field in a Canadian University or College. Selection committee considers candidates who demonstrate the highest ideal and qualities of citizenship and humanitarian service as well as excellence in academics, amateur sport, fitness, health and volunteer community service. Application deadline is February 1<sup>st</sup>.

**25. TOYOTA EARTH DAY SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM - \$5,000**

Primary criteria are commitment and service to community environmental issues, academic achievement and volunteerism or leadership. **3. FACULTÉ SAINT-JEAN ENTRANCE AWARDS - \$1000**

Numerous scholarships are available to various students pursuing first year studies at the University of Alberta Faculté Saint Jean. Contact a counsellor or consult the U of A calendar.

**4. LEADERSHIP AWARDS COMPETITION - 150 Awards from \$1,000 to \$5,000**

The Entrance Leadership Awards Program recognizes students who demonstrate exceptional leadership through school and community involvement while maintaining superior academic standing (award average of 80%+ based on Grade 11 & 12 final marks). Must be entering an undergraduate degree program at the University of Alberta in September. Deadline March 15<sup>th, 2006</sup>. Applications available after mid December in PDF format at [www.registrar.ualberta.ca/awards](http://www.registrar.ualberta.ca/awards) (navigate to Entrance Students, Entrance Leadership to download).

**5. SCHOLASTIC DISTINCTION COMPETITION - \$10,000 to \$25,000 (payable over 4 years)**

Should have a minimum average of 90% if entering Agriculture, Forestry, Home Economics; Campus Saint-Jean; Native Studies; Nursing; and Physical Education and Recreation. For all other faculties, awards average should be 95% or higher in Grades 10, 11 and 12 (and equivalent grades on any completed post-secondary work). Candidates must be nominated by their high school/post-secondary institution. Deadline is March 1<sup>st</sup>. Applications usually available in the week before Christmas break in PDF format from [www.registrar.ualberta.ca/awards](http://www.registrar.ualberta.ca/awards) (Navigate to Entrance Students, Scholastic Distinction to download).

## **SECTION VIII - UNIVERSITY OF CALGARY SCHOLARSHIPS**

**1. ENTRANCE AWARDS - \$500 to \$5,000**

Entrance Scholarships are available to students entering their first year of post-secondary studies at the University of Calgary. Generally recipients of awards must have achieved above-average grades in five appropriate 20-level courses (grade 11) and in some cases must demonstrate financial need.

Students MUST apply for Entrance Awards using the on-line application. Applications will be available online at the Student Awards and Financial Aid site as of November 1, 2005. Applicants must first have applied for admission to the University of Calgary. Deadline March 1.

**2. UNIVERSITY OF CALGARY OUTSTANDING ACHIEVEMENT AWARDS – \$11,500 to \$24,000 payable over 4 years**

Outstanding Achievement Awards are available to students entering their first year of post-secondary studies in a Fall Session at the University of Calgary. Students must normally have earned a minimum average of 88% throughout high school to apply for Outstanding Achievement Awards. Deadline is December 1<sup>st</sup>. Applications available in October.

## **SECTION IX - UNIVERSITY OF LETHBRIDGE AWARDS**

### **1. EARLY ENTRANCE AWARDS - \$500 - \$5,000**

One application for four different scholarships. Consult the Awards and Scholarship section of the University of Lethbridge Calendar for eligibility criteria. (Number of each award may vary and often more than one is given.) Ask for the application form from the school office. An essay and/or reference letters may be requested. Deadline April 1.

### **2. HIGHSCHOOL APPLICANT AWARDS - Value: up to \$2,000**

25 awards are available based on your actual admission average as well as other criteria, such as financial need, volunteer experience and artistic ability. For students entering in Fall 2003, the application deadline date will be June 1, and November 1 for Spring Entrance.

### **3. GRADE 11 MERIT AWARD – Approximately 100 scholarships of \$800**

To be completed by students currently in Grade 11 who plan to attend the University of Lethbridge in Fall. Students with an 80% average and over are encouraged to apply.

## **SECTION X - RED DEER COLLEGE ENTRANCE AWARDS**

One application is used for all Entrance Awards and Scholarships to Red Deer College:

### **1. CENTRAL ALBERTA HIGH SCHOOL AWARD - \$1000**

The award is based on leadership, academic standing and involvement in activities. Applicants must include two letters of reference. Deadline is March 31.

### **2. RED DEER COLLEGE ENTRANCE SCHOLARSHIPS**

There are a number of Entrance Scholarships available to Red Deer College applicants. For further details, check with the Red Deer College Awards Office.

### **3. RED DEER COLLEGE TECH PREP GRADUATE AWARD - \$1000**

A Central Alberta student must have graduated with a Central Alberta Technology Preparation credential and be entering full time studies at Red Deer College. Preference will be given to a student entering a program which formally recognizes articulation competencies developed in high school. Deadline is March 31.

## **SECTION XI – CANADIAN UNIVERSITY COLLEGE ENTRANCE SCHOLARSHIPS**

To qualify for an entrance scholarship at Canadian University college, you must:

- Be a Canadian Citizen or a landed immigrant.
- Have submitted an application for academic admission to Canadian University College.
- Provide a Social Insurance Number prior to claiming any award
- Be a recent secondary school graduate **and** have no university transfer credit.
- Register for and successfully complete a minimum 80% course load per semester (12 credits) during the school year. One half of the total scholarship amount will be awarded each qualifying semester.

### **Deadline**

It is the student's responsibility to ensure that all reference letters and verifying documentation for each award arrive in the Student Finance office by September 30 for evaluation.



**1. PRESIDENT'S AWARD FOR ACADEMIC EXCELLENCE**

Renewable for 3 years

Average based on 30-level diploma exam courses or equivalent.

Minimum Average: 90%      Award Amount: \$3,000

**2. PRESIDENT'S AWARD FOR OUTSTANDING LEADERSHIP**

Recognize achievement in leadership roles. Minimum average requirement of 70%.

Student Council President: \$1,000

Yearbook Editor \$500

Student Council Vice President: \$500

**3. PRESIDENT'S AWARD FOR OUTSTANDING CITIZENSHIP - \$1,000**

Available to students who have made significant contributions during their high school years in categories (such as church involvement, other on or off campus leadership roles) not covered by the leadership awards.

Minimum average requirement: 70%. Must submit a letter outlining your activities and two reference letters, one from a principal, guidance counselor or teacher and the second from a local minister or youth leader.

**4. PRESIDENT'S AWARD FOR OUTSTANDING MUSICIANSHIP**

Recognizes musical excellence and achievement during your secondary school studies. To qualify, you must be a high school graduate with a minimum average of 70% as well as one of the following:

a) Minimum score of 85% on a Royal Conservatory Grade 10 practical exam or minimum score of 90% on a RC Grade 9 Practical exam. Award Amount: \$2,000

b) Minimum score of 75% on a RC Grade 10 practical exam or minimum score of 80% on a RC Grade 9 practical exam. Award Amount: \$1,000

c) Send all of the following: A letter outlining significant musical activities, awards, etc.; a recording of yourself performing two contrasting selections; two letters of reference, one being from your music teacher or school/church music director, and the second being from another professional musician, pastor or teacher. Award Amount: up to \$2,000, depending on evaluation by the CUC Music Department faculty.

**SECTION XII - ESSAY AWARDS**

**1. ALBERTA ASSOCIATION OF SCHOOL RESOURCE OFFICERS (AASRO) AND TRANSCANADA PIPELINES LIMITED STUDENT ESSAY CONTEST - \$2,500, \$1000 and \$500**

Requires a 1,500-word essay: 2006 topic: Choosing your future: What inspires or guides your choices? LCHS Scholarship Committee will select one essay from all entries for submission to AASRO. Deadline at LCHS April 1, to allow time for judging.

**2. ALBERTA PRESS COUNCIL SCHOLARSHIP - \$1000**

Applicants proceeding to post-secondary studies are eligible to apply. An essay is requested with the application. Applications available near mid December. Deadline is January 15

**3. CANADIAN WAR MUSEUM HISTORY AWARD - \$1000**

Five awards given on the basis of a 1500-2000 word essay dealing with a question relating to Canada's military history. The essay topic differs each year. Must plan to attend university in the fall and be enrolled in at least one history course in the fall semester. Applications usually available in late January. Deadline March 31<sup>st</sup>.

**4. EF GLOBAL CITIZEN AWARD: \$1,500 toward university or college tuition plus travel with the EF group on a 10-day expenses paid educational tour of Europe. Honourable mentions will also be rewarded. Selection is based on an essay submission. Deadline Feb. 15.**

**5. THE FRASER INSTITUTE - \$250**

Student essay contest: submission of a 1000 to 1500 word essay required. Topic changes annually, to be announced in September at [www.fraserinstitute.ca](http://www.fraserinstitute.ca). Deadline June 4

6. **GRANT MACEWAN YOUNG WRITER'S SCHOLARSHIP** - \$2,500  
Based on an essay or short story that is between 1,000 and 5,000 words in length. Scholarships awarded annually to four young Alberta writers who create a literary work reflecting Alberta and/or Dr. MacEwan's interests. Applications usually available in mid-November. Deadline December 29
7. **ISABEL MILLER YOUNG WRITERS AWARD (Poetry or Fiction)** - \$100, \$200 and \$300  
Submissions must be accompanied by an entry fee of \$5.00 for this Writers Guild of Alberta award. Submissions to be fiction of 1000 words or less and/or poems of 500 words or less.
8. **MOORE SHILLETTO SOCIAL STUDIES ESSAY AWARD** - \$350  
(1<sup>st</sup> prize \$250; 2 honourable mentions \$50 each)  
This award is given annually to a deserving student enrolled in LCHS upon selection by the Moore Shilleto Selection Committee on the basis of a written essay. This award honours the vision of Canada as a just society; acknowledges the sacrifices of our pioneers and recognizes that they survived through cooperation. Our pioneers created a legacy of public services, such as education and health, which continues to benefit all citizens.  
Essays should be 800-1000 words in length and reflect careful thought and effective research. Proper documentation must be provided. Due date May 31<sup>st</sup>. Essay topics will be available at the counselling offices by April 1<sup>st</sup>.
9. **RE/MAX "QUEST FOR EXCELLENCE" SCHOOL BURSARY** - \$500  
Twenty individual bursaries of \$500 given to Western Canadian Grade 12 students based on an essay. Applications available mid October. Deadline March 10
10. **ROYAL CANADIAN LEGION POSTER AND LITERARY CONTESTS**  
National Prizes - Category 1 Senior, Grades 10, 11 & 12: first Prize \$275 and a trip for two to Ottawa to participate in the National Remembrance Day Ceremony. Second prize \$200. Applications and information usually available in the second week of October.
11. **YOUNG WOMAN OF VISION BURASRY** – the equivalent of one year of tuition to MacEwan College  
Grant MacEwan College and Global's Woman of Vision jointly sponsor this Young Woman of Vision Bursary for women entering their first year of post-secondary education at Grant MacEwan. Applicants must submit an essay outlining their long-range goals and vision for their future. Applications usually available in late October. Deadline January 24.
