Grade 1 – 8

Students supported at Olds Career High campus. Parents and/or students meet with Mrs. Dagg 2-4 times/month in Olds, Sundre or Innisfail.

Support Student Learning/Challenges

- > Provide home education programming, assessment & reading level
- Provide support to parents with curriculum and learning strategies
- > Organize special learning opportunities & special event days
- > Four core subject/grade = 32 courses to be proficient & require materials
- > ADLC materials are used for 100% of the courses (ADLC closure)
