The cost of this trip has been fixed at \$2850 per person. This would include: airport transfers from Didsbury to YYC, airfare, transportation while in Nova Scotia and PEI, accommodation, breakfasts and suppers, admission to all group attractions and activities, and a DHS Music tour jacket.

At this time all travelers (including chaperones) should have \$900 in their tour accounts. The next payment of \$500 is due Friday, December 9th.


