The Seven Effective Study Tips

Dr. Robert Bjork, Professor of Psychology, University of California

- 1. Allocate your attention efficiently.
- 2. Interpret and elaborate on what you are trying to learn.
- 3. Make your studying variable (e.g. location, interpretations, examples).
- 4. Space your studying of a topic or area and repeat your study several times.
- 5. Organize and structure the information that you are trying to learn.
- 6. Visualize the information. Reinstate the context during the test.
- 7. GENERATE, GENERATE! RETRIEVE, RETRIEVE, RETRIEVE!

What do they mean?

1. You need to be attentive and concentrating while you study

a. or it just won't stick with you. We have all had the experience of reading a page and almost immediately realizing we don't remember a word we read because our minds we elsewhere while reading. THAT'S NO GOOD FOR STUDYING. When you divide your attention, everything suffers.

2. Put the learning into your own words!

- a. Re-word the learning so that it makes sense to you and is in an easily digestible form for your brain.
- b. This is called deep processing... where you truly have to understand it to learn it... so put in the time it requires to truly understand it.

3. Repetition just doesn't work and you can only concentrate for so long before your mind gets bored!.

- a. So, vary your interpretation and examples so that your brain doesn't get bored! The best example is a sport... you have to take the shot from various locations, to truly learn how to make the shots.
- b. Take regular breaks... know when you need a break so you use your time effectively

4. Cramming for the test doesn't work!

- a. For true long term learning you must study a number of times and repeat the studying of information to make sure it sticks!
- b. So, if you have two exams to study for, you are better to study for one for a while, and then switch and study for the other, and then switch again. (This links with point #3)

5. Again, structure the information so that it easily fits your learning style, memory style and recall style

- a. This learning has to fit into the storage areas of your brain, and those storage areas are unique to you. So make sure to restructure the information so as to fit you.
- b. Create an overview linking the ideas, structure it so the information has a flow for you... these all work for better understanding.

6. Draw it, create a picture, a mind map, a mnemonic.

a. then during the test, restate the question so that it fits the format you have created for understanding.

7. Generate means to try and attempt to answer the question, before looking at the correct solution. Retrieval practice means practicing getting information out of your brain a number of times before you actually need it.

- a. ...even taking a wild guess and following through with it... before going and looking at the correct solution... for some reason creates better understanding.
- b. Reviewing a past solution that you have developed will prepare you for any similar questions you might see in the future... but not just reviewing it... asking yourself to answer it again, and then checking if you got it.
