Principal's Message

Today marks the beginning of the second half of the school year and with it a host of changes to most students' schedules and teachers' timetables. At this time, a few of our Grade 12 students will have already completed all the requirements of a high school diploma and will shortly be receiving that diploma in the mail. We congratulate them on that milestone even though many of those students will continue to come to school to complete requirements for post-secondary admissions. All students from 9-12 will also be exploring new complementary courses and beginning a new set of core classes.

The first few days of the semester are usually quite busy with course changes. During the time that Mr. Dick is on leave, the primary responsibility for those changes will lay with Mrs. Roy and Mrs. Wassmer who are based in the Career High. Students wishing to change their schedules should make an appointment at the main office. The Career High team, Mrs. Doiron or Mr. MacDonald will then meet with them to discuss the changes they wish to make.

Now that exams are done and we are moving into a new semester, we would like to invite all of our students, staff, and parents to reflect on the past five months. Our students should examine their study and work habits of the past semester and see if there are changes they could make to improve those habits that might positively impact their success going forward. DHS teachers met on the Organizational Day on January 30 to reflect on our first half of the year and discussed possible changes in practices for the second half. Parents might wish to take the new start to investigate whether some changes to routines at home would have a positive effect on their children's success at school -- whether it be setting aside dedicated homework time or limiting late-night technology use to name a few examples.

Things that will not be changing include the fact that all final exams in June will be worth no more than 20% -- keeping us aligned with the stated value of Diploma Exams and first-semester exam weighting.

I would like to take the opportunity to thank all the parents who filled out the survey about School Council. Based on the feedback, we are going to try an online meeting on February 7 at an earlier time to see if we can get more involvement. We hope that all our students took the opportunity to relax and recharge over their three-day weekend and we look forward to a great second semester here at DHS.

Acting in support of our commitment to our 900 Indigenous students and their families, and to embrace Indigenous Learning for all students and staff, we will be installing Treaty flags inside schools across our division as a sign of respect to Indigenous Peoples.

Recently, our Board of Trustees, Leadership Team, and School Administration Teams shared an important flag ceremony with Elders, Knowledge Keepers and special guests from Treaty 6, Treaty 7 and the Métis Nation.

It was a touching and historic moment for our school division. It fills us with tremendous pride as we continue to make authentic steps forward with respect to truth and reconciliation. It was a special day in our critically important journey.

I would like to thank our Indigenous Learning team for bringing us together with our honoured guests, and to all our administrators, staff and trustees for what they have all done to this point and for what they will continue to do.

The admin team from your child's school will provide further information on their own flag ceremony as their plans evolve, and we thank you for walking alongside us throughout this journey. In Chinook's Edge, our actions will always speak louder than our words.


