How is High School Different Than Junior High?

- Greater responsibility.
- You can fail and repeat courses.
- Credits determine graduation.
- Most academic courses are offered in advanced (university or college) and general streams (college and trades).

- Some courses you take will have students that are not in your grade



Additional Programs \rightarrow Off Campus



- Green Certificate
 - Credit for demonstrating proficiency in agriculture-based disciplines
- Registered Apprenticeship Program
 - \circ ~ Earn credits as your work toward your apprenticeship
- Dual Credit
 - Earn both high school and post-secondary credits/credentials
- Career Exploration Internship
- Special Projects
- Work Experience

These programs typically start <u>after</u> the grade 10 year.
