Thank you Dragons, for helping to make this a fantastic place to be every day!








Leadership News





DUAL CREDIT

Fall 2025 Dual credit offerings are now posted at the school and you can sign up to register with Mrs. Roy. Dual credit is a unique career exploration opportunity that allows students to enroll in a college course while still in high school. They would take this course in their option block and earn 5 high school credits and 3 college credits upon completion. In order to be accepted into these college level programs, students need to be motivated learners who will attend to the online learning environment with limited supervision and have the maturity to handle the responsibilities of course expectations/deadlines/etc.

The following online courses will be offered:

 Accounting Principles, Intro to the Vet Profession, Solving Technology Problems, Applied Ecology, Fundamentals of Controlled Environment Agriculture, Global and Sustainable Tourism, Marking Principles, Digital Media Production (Video, Audio and Images), Sports Management, Principles of Psychology, Personal Fitness and Wellness, Biology of Health

We also offer onsite courses through Olds College and RDP. Busing is provided for SOME of these opportunities but others will require students to find their own transportation. Onsite courses include:

Readiness for the Skilled trades level 1 (Olds College), Readiness for the Skilled Trades Level 2 Welding, Readiness for the Skilled Trades Level 2 HET- Hydraulics and Electrical, Olds College




